SA Špičák - The Špičák walking tour

INFORMATION ABOUT THE TRAIL

Starting point: SA Špičák Finish point: SA Špičák Length of trail: 6.3 km Time required: 1.5 h Climb difficulty: medium Downhill difficulty: low Height difference: 295 m The lowest point of the trail: 865 m above sea level The highest point of the trail: 1,160 m above sea level

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

From the SA Špičák through the chair lift clearing about 400 m uphill onto the crossing with a yellow envelope, turn left here and go straight on towards Devil's Lake, at the crossing with a red tourist mark turn right and climb up following the red tourist mark and the yellow envelope to Rozvodi/ Watershed (the highest trail point 1,160 m above sea level). From here downhill along the so-called Rozvodská cesta/Watershed Way (a blue tourist mark). Turn right at its end to follow the blue envelope NT Špičák to Prokop's Meadow. The mark (even a single trail for bikes) crosses slopes, use one the slopes to get to the SA Špičák.

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

From the Špičák Saddle Parking Place (starting point of tourist tracks) follow the red tourist mark to the peak of Pancii (the highest trail point - 1,214 m above sea level, a possibility to have some refreshment). From the peak go downhill, following the west direction, using the slope of the ski site Pancir. From the lower station of the ski tow go on, following the blue tourist mark back to the

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

From the railway station Špičák follow the blue tourist mark to the SA Špičák, then follow the green tourist mark to the tourist crossroads under Weiss's Meadow, go on, cross the road and the ski slope on Weiss's Meadow at the end of the ski tow. From here keep following the green tourist mark across the tourist crossroads Pod Švýcárnou/Under Švýcárna to the chair lift interstation Hofmanky. Then under the chait lift, using the slope onto the peak of Pancif (a possibility to have some refreshment). From the peak of Pancír go downhill. This is the same way to Hofmanky and from here follow the blue tourist mark across the crossroads Under Hofmanky along a maintained ski trail to here go downhill, using the slope to the railway the upper ski tow station SA above the railway station Železná Ruda – town.



From the petrol station Benzina in Železná Ruda climb up, following the blue tourist mark, about 1 km to the crossroads with the red tourist mark (Adolf Kašpar's memorial), to the right here and follow the red tourist mark to Devil's Lake. Leave Devil's Lake following the yellow envelope and go downhill using one of the slopes there to get to the chair lift in the SA Špičák.


